As a parish within the Diocese of Phoenix, we regularly present a program for all new employees and volunteers titled Called to Protect for Ministries. In this program you will learn myths and facts about sexual abuse and sexual offenders, detailed warning signs to watch for in adults who may abuse, and how to identify children who may have been abused. You will also learn specific steps to take in screening and guidelines for interaction, monitoring, training and responding.

This interactive program is mandatory for all employees, and volunteers that serve within the Diocese of Phoenix. Due to the sensitive nature of the topic no one under 18 years old is permitted to attend this session. You may register for this workshop online at

At the workshop, you will be asked to sign a Code of Ethics based on the diocese's Policy and Procedures for the Protection of Minors. Please take a moment to review the policy by visiting the [safe environment](#) page for the Diocese of Phoenix.

You will also be asked to complete a diocesan volunteer application. Please plan to bring a list of your previous volunteer experience, with the name and contact information for your volunteer supervisors, as well as contact information (name, address, and phone number) for at least three references (one professional, one personal, and one family member).

St. Vincent de Paul Society



Spirituality is the *first* objective of the Society.

Our primary purpose is not to bring help to the poor,
At least when defined as material or financial assistance.

Our primary purpose is to bring the love and peace
of Christ to those who are suffering.

In doing so, we bring the gift of *ourselves* and *our time*.

Nonetheless, as St. James so aptly says, it is difficult to minister to someone's soul when that person's body is hungry or naked.

Missionaries of all faiths have historically found that they had to minister to the physical needs of those in their care before they could effectively preach the Gospel:

"What does it profit, my brethren, if a man says he has faith, but has not works? Can his faith save him? If a brother or sister is ill-clad and in lack of daily food, and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace, be warmed and filled,'" without giving them the things needed for the body, what does it profit? So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead."

Although our objective is to bring love and peace, when we see our brother or sister suffering, we naturally want to help.

So we collect food and raise funds in order to help and demonstrate the truth of the central message of Christianity - -
love one another.

This is a simple act of living out our faith. We share in some small way what we have, with those who have less. In doing so, we cause the poor to see our good works and give glory and praise to God. Saint Matthew expressed it:

*"You are the light of the world.
Men do not light a lamp and then put it under a bushel basket.
They set it on a stand where it gives light to all...
In the same way, your light must shine before all men
So that they may see your good works
And give praise and glory to your heavenly Father."*
